FAISON HIGH SCHOOL

CALYPSO-FAISON, NORTH CAROLINA: — The two small high schools of Calypso and Faison, realizing the need for better facilities and increased opportunities of education of the children of these communities, decided to consolidate.

With this consolidation the students from Calypso and Faison would begin years of working together as one uni-

Finally on January 2, 1956, the students of North Duplin moved into their new building (pictured at right). This ultra-modern building is located between the two communities of Calypso and Faison.

North Duplin, since its consolidation, offers many advantages in both scholastics and extracurricular activities. Scholastically, it has added subjects to the curricu-

On August 23, 1955, an idea which had begun to evolve several years before became a reality. The first year of North Duplin High School began. Until the new school being built to accommodate North Duplin students was finished, the students attended the Calypso High School building.

The crossed Confederate flags, with the small circles and names inscribed, are used to represent the two loyal southern schools, Faison-Calypto, which chose to prove that in unity there is strength.

The large circle with North Duplin, the prominent name, and the one large Confederate flag represents the consolidation of the two fine high schools.

Citizenship, love, and loyalty to our country are signified by an eagle with outspread wings.

Above the eagle, on the emblem, there are three stars that represent the spiritual living that means so much to each individual in the traits of character: Honesty, cour-

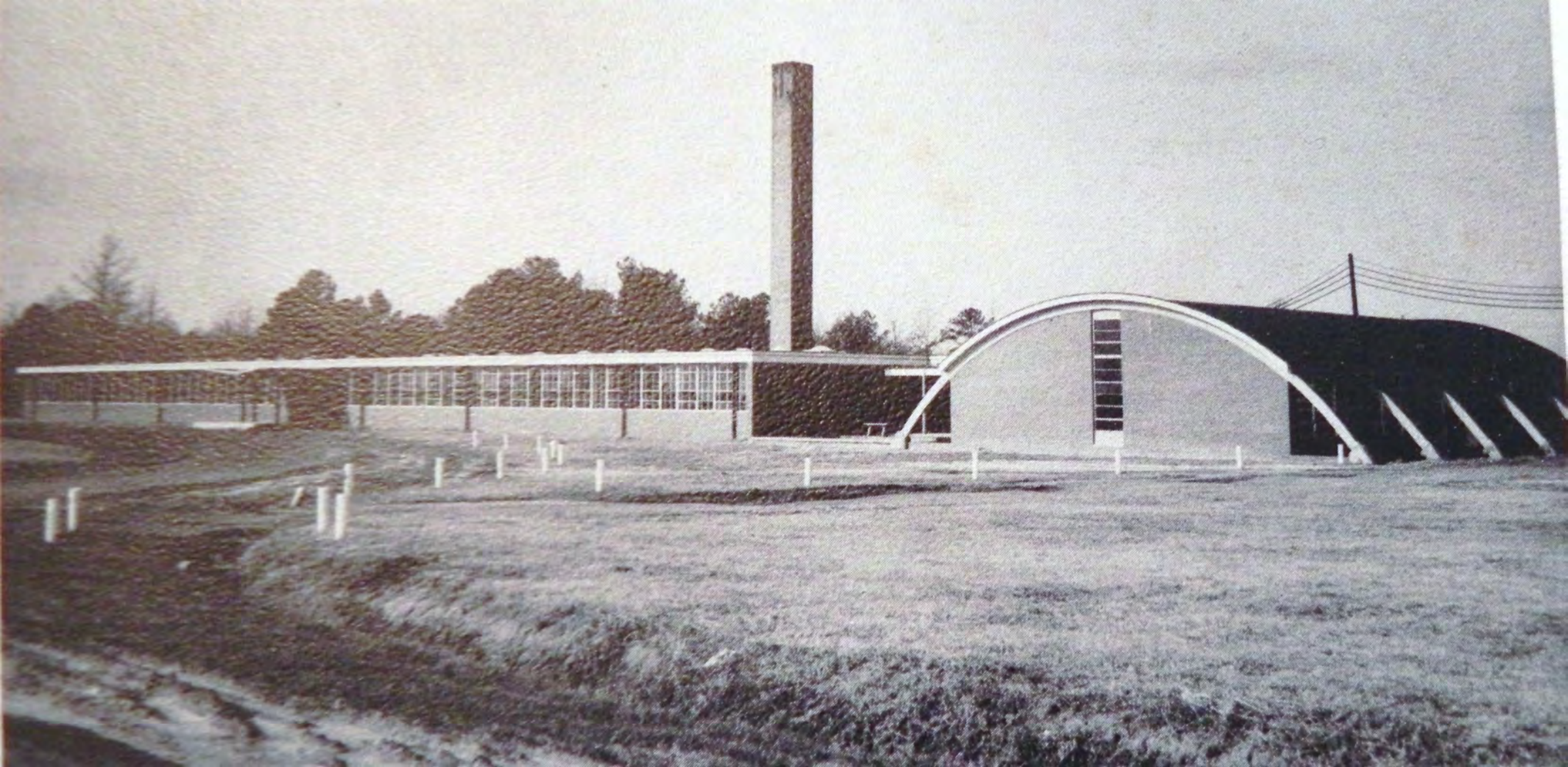
age, and loyalty. May all students passing through our school's doors serve both God and nation.

The torch of knowledge and both the open and closed books signifies the educational growth and progress. May we combine all the others with education for dignity, restraint, and seriousness in our search for knowledge and truth.

The olive wreath around the bottom of the emblem represents peace, love, friendship, and brotherhood between the two communities and may it grow and deepen into the richest and closest bond.

The green on a background of white represents our school's colors, green and white. The green shows life. Life is a prerequisite to growth and progress. May our school work for only those qualities which make for a full, honorable, and useful life. The background of white on which these symbols are displayed, represents purity in our personal and school relationships.

The school's motto is inscribed over the olive wreath. The motto is by one of the Latin writers, Lucretius. In Latin it is Bonum Summum Quo Tendimus Omnes, which means, "The Highest Good At Which We All Aim."



North Duplin-

The buildings of North Duplin are all important. The cafeteria, a very essential building, was completed in October of 1957. It is a well equipped, modern building. It is doing double-duty at present by serving as cafeteria and auditorium.

In the early spring of 1959, another building was added. This was the agriculture building. This saved trips to the old building at Calypso, as well as offering better equipment for the boys' work.



Consolidation introduced a new sport, football, which wasn't played in either school, but has been added to our program. This sport made possible the building of one of the best football fields in the conference. The athletic field was named Grubbs Athletic Field, in honor of our principal, Mr. Grubbs.

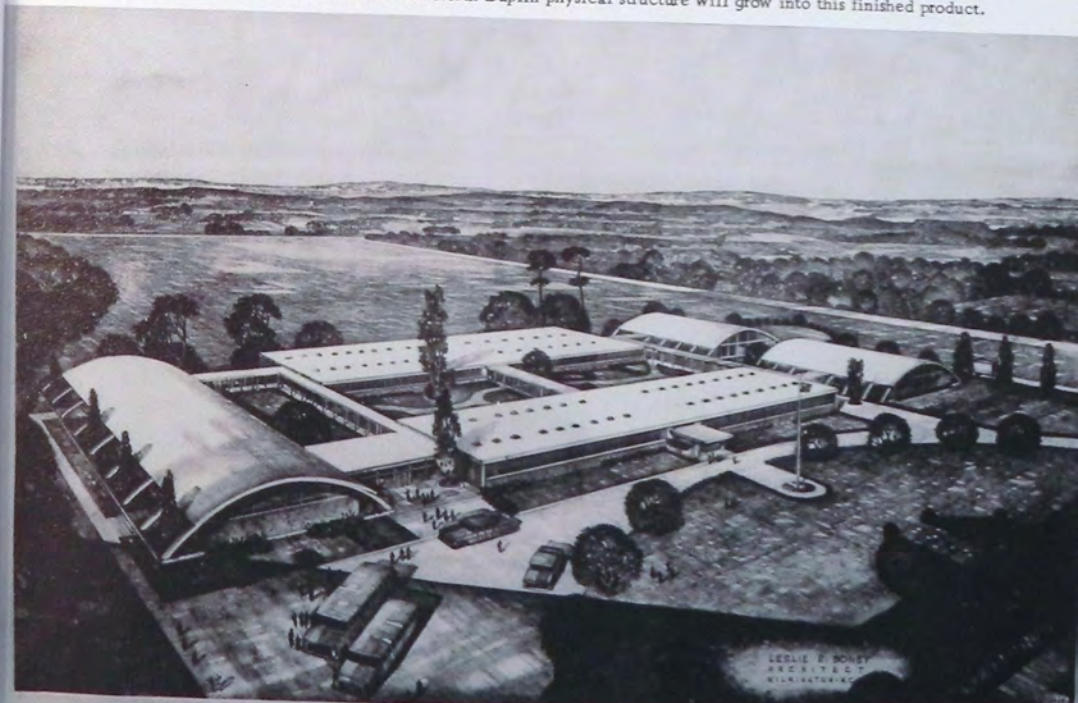
The athletic field, consisting of both the football field and baseball field, was completed in 1959, when the baseball field was added.

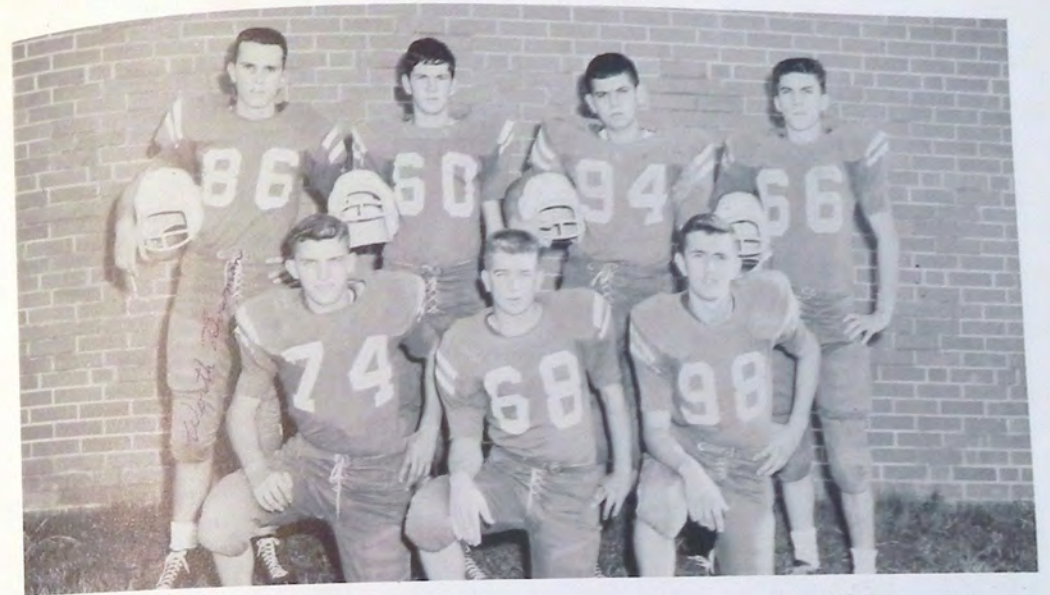
