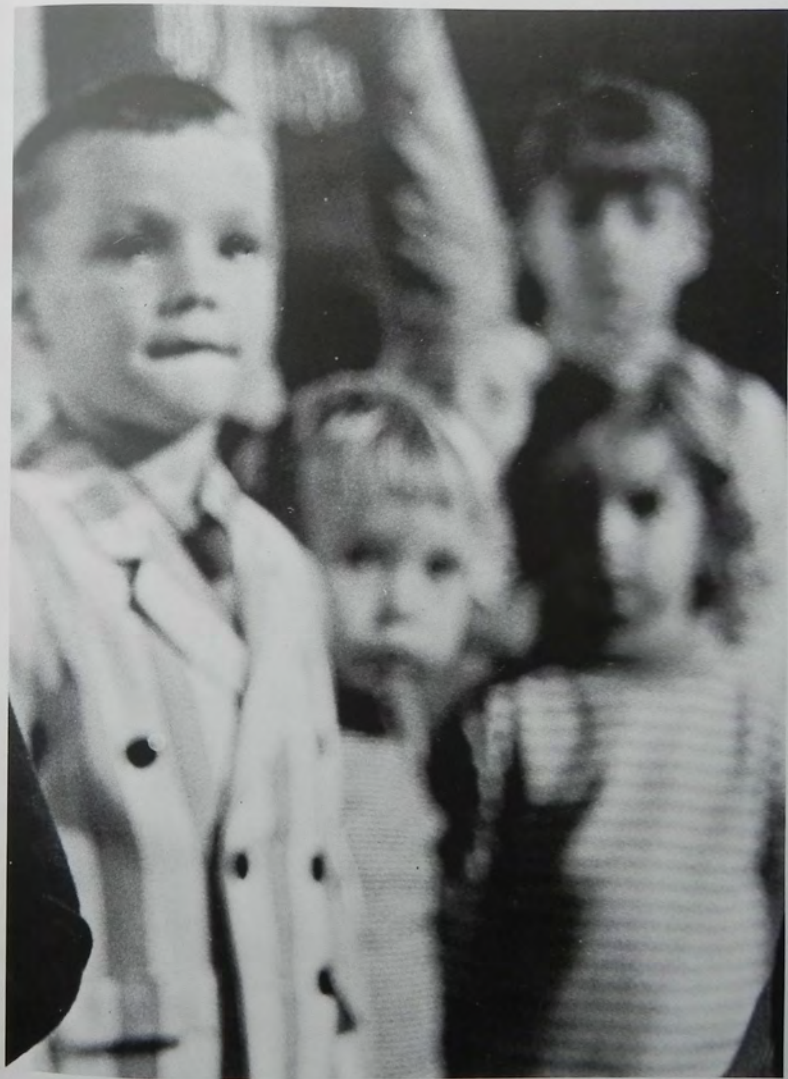

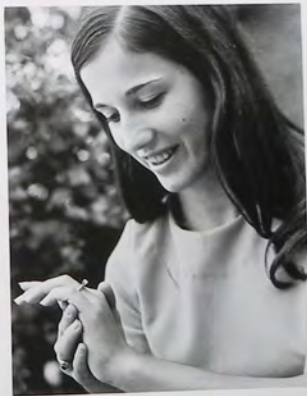

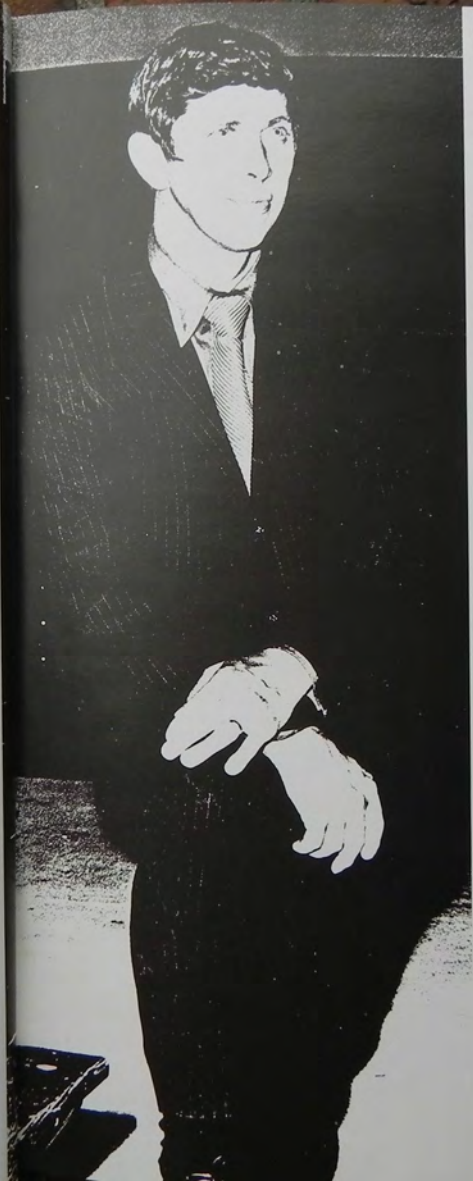

Saratoga Falls, E. Wayne Whipped

On August 28, the North Duplin Rebels donned their green and gold uniforms to begin a new season by playing Saratoga. The Rebels, obviously looking ahead to Eastern Wayne, played very unimpressively. While the offense, which never could get rolling, mustered up two touchdowns the defense did a creditable job allowing only 29 yards rushing. Final score: North Duplin 14 and Saratoga 7.

It was a silent bus that traveled to Eastern Wayne to play in what was dubbed as the Tri County Conference Championship. The game started, the rain started, and the Rebels tore loose on what looked like wet puppies in the rain. The game was never really a contest because it was won in the minds of the Rebels before the opening whistle. When it was all over, Eastern Wayne had 20 yards total offense and had entered Rebel territory only once the entire night. Final score: North Duplin 14 and Eastern Wayne 0. Eastern Wayne offers the rain as a feeble excuse, but we who saw them totally demolished by the Green Machine know better.





Rebels Crush Opponents

When the Rebel offense finally swung into high gear to help the stingy defense, North Duplin began crushing its opponents by fantastic scores. First, Littlefield was subdued 27-0. Then, after hearing of their top 1-A ranking, the Rebels walloped Midway 50-8. In what turned out to be an exciting game, Union fell to the Green Machine 48-20. Next came a 55-8 rout over Acme Delco.

Against Southport the Rebel first stringers ran up an unbelievable halftime score of 49-0 and then watched the younger boys play the second half. Final score: North Duplin 64 and Southport 0. The sweetest of all these magnificent victories was the 53-0 homecoming victory over Roseboro-Salemburg which gave the Rebels another Tri County Conference Championship.



With only two regular season games remaining the Rebels had a perfect 8-0 record. The last two games, the first against 3A Hobbton and the second against 2A East Duplin, would show whether the Rebels were really a championship team. Against Hobbton, North Duplin fell behind in the score for the first time the entire year. Disgusted by this, the Rebels roared back to score three quick first half touchdowns and went on to win 28-7. In the hard fought East Duplin game the score was knotted 14-14 at half. The Rebels came back for the second half with a determined attitude, and when the final whistle blew, North Duplin stood 10-0 having whipped East Duplin 29-14.



Play-Off Action

Revenge. This is what was on the minds of the Rebels as they prepared to play St. Pauls for the district championship. The year before, North Duplin had lost to St. Pauls in the districts. But this time the story was different as the Rebels gained a 23-8 victory. North Duplin had won their revenge.

In what everyone knew was really the state championship, North Duplin traveled to the mountains to battle Robbinsville. Here, in the mountains, the Rebels felt the sting of defeat for the first time. Was it poor officiating, a hobbled quarterback, or terrible playing conditions, that led to the Rebel's 8-6 downfall? Let us not be like Eastern Wayne, offering weak excuses. Let us be realistic, recognizing that the Rebels simply had an off night. Maybe with a couple of breaks . . . but, it is in the past now. Next time . . . for 14 seniors there is no next time. For them it is all over with, except for those memories they will carry forever.

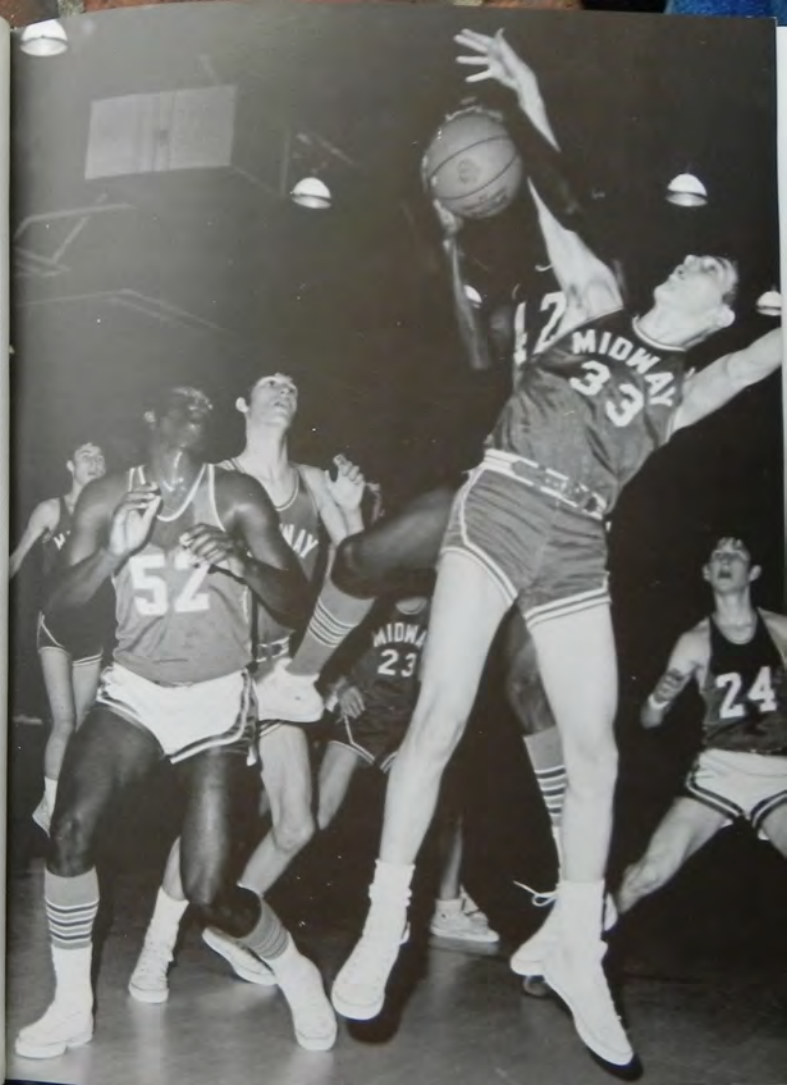

The next year, as sophomores, they did make North Duplin a winner. With only four seniors, two juniors, and a crew of inexperienced, but determined sophomores the team surprised everyone by reeling off seven straight victories. Then came the humiliating loss that cost the Rebels sole ownership to the Tri-County Championship and a play-off berth.

As juniors, the Rebels had one goal — to win outright the Championship. The year overall was not extremely exciting but the crown was won and for the first time ever North Duplin was in the play-offs. In the play-off game the Rebels were soundly whipped by St. Pauls.

At last, the year of all years. The year the Rebels finally got it all together. The fourteen seniors who had given North Duplin its greatest three years of football realized there was no tomorrow. Eleven straight, devastating victories came before the Rebels were beaten in the semi-finals by Robbinsville. Even with the disappointing end, it was a wonderful year overall.

Throughout all four years, the Rebels were led by two dedicated men who were responsible for their success. Coach Richard Kaleel and Coach Kenneth Avert are to be commended for the outstanding job they have done in serving North Duplin High School and the North Duplin community. A small school, like North Duplin, is lucky to have coaches like Coach Kaleel and Coach Avert.

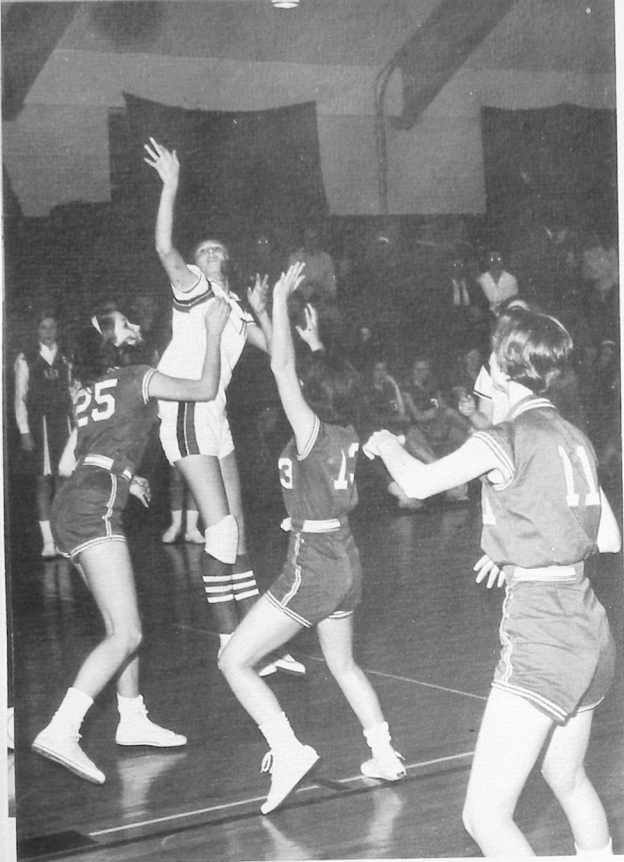

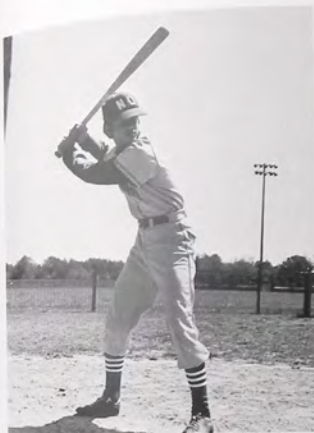

All Conference

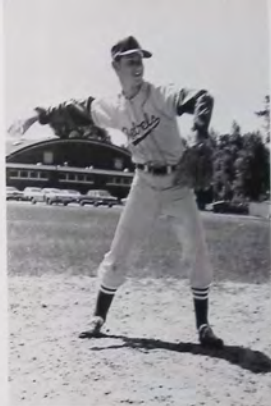
